What is Project TEACH Outside?

Project TEACH Outside is an education program open to people living with HIV who have been recently incarcerated. *Project TEACH Outside* teaches participants about:

- Living healthy with HIV
- Basic HIV treatment information
- Getting the most from your health care
- Strategies for dealing with life on the outside
- Getting benefits with a criminal record
- And more...

According to recent studies, almost one in four people with HIV in the U.S. have been incarcerated at some point in their lives. HIV and incarceration is a very common combination. But there are hardly any programs specifically for HIV positive people who have done time in prison. *Project TEACH Outside* brings important information to ex-prisoners and their communities.

Program Details:

Project TEACH Outside is a five-week course. Classes meet two times a week, on Wednesdays and Fridays, from 10am to 1pm. Lunch is provided after class from 1pm to 2pm. *Project TEACH Outside* courses are held four times a year in the Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter. We are always accepting new applications.

Project TEACH Outside is coordinated by Philadelphia FIGHT. Classes are held at Philadelphia FIGHT's offices, 1233 Locust Street. Please contact us to find out the start date and location of the next class.
